What is HEOP?

The Arthur O. Eve Higher Education Opportunity Program (HEOP) provides up to ten semesters of academic support and supplementary financial assistance to eligible New York State residents who do not meet the traditional admissions criteria but demonstrate potential for the academic success.


HEOP at Marymount Manhattan College

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Celebrating 50 Years of HEOP

In 1969, New York State assemblyman Arthur O. Eve established the Higher Education Opportunity Program (HEOP) to provide access to independent colleges and universities for economically and educationally disadvantaged students from across the state.

When the New York State Legislature established the Program, MMC's preexisting Community Leadership Program (CLP) was immediately awarded a grant and accepted into the State's HEOP, paving the way for a seamless transition to a new funding format. Today, there are 52 independent colleges and universities across New York that participate in HEOP, serving disadvantaged students from every county in the state.





The College hosted a Golden Jubilee Celebration in October 2019 as part of Family and Friends Homecoming Weekend to celebrate 50 years of HEOP. City Councilor Adrienne E. Adams of Jamaica, Queens gave the keynote address and praised MMC's longstanding commitment to educational access and equity.

In addition, Dr. Eilene Bertsch, the first Grant Writer and Director of the Higher Education Opportunity Program at MMC, was honored for her decades of service at the October celebration.

Summer Academic Institute

The Summer Academic Institute (SAI) is a six-week academic and social orientation that assists incoming students with the transition to college-level studies. The curriculum emphasizes the strengthening of writing and math skills, and also includes cultural trips, guest speakers, volunteer activities, and workshops on library research. Students earn three credits at the completion of the program.







HEOP pre-first year students follow a very rigorous schedule throughout the summer program. Students are required to be in the HEOP office no later than 8:59 am to promote timeliness! If one person is late then, whole group is considered late – a motto which encourages self accountability and team building. In addition to classes, the the students engage in various ice-breaker games (top right) to encourage cohesion amongst the group.
