Program Change Week - What You Need to Know

SO YOU WANT TO MAKE A CHANGE TO YOUR FALL SCHEDULE?

FIRST YEAR AND TRANSFER STUDENTS

Before contacting an Academic Advisor about a change, please look through the <u>Course Bulletin</u> to make sure the class you want to add is open (please refer to the <u>Catalog</u> for course descriptions). Also, pay close attention to the meeting times, especially for those of you in different time zones.

Send an email (from your MMC account) to an Academic Advisor to make any changes to your course schedule (see below for contacts). When you email the advisor, please include:

- -Your name
- -Student ID
- -Course(s) you are dropping (include course code, section, day(s) and times)
- -Course(s) you are adding (include course code, section, day(s) and times)

If there are any concerns or issues, the advisor will reach out to you.

CONTINUING STUDENTS

This year, continuing students can make changes to their fall class schedules directly through MMC Connect, similar to registration. If you would like to drop a class and add a new one, please do the following:

- -Review the **Course Bulletin** to make sure that the class you want is open.
- -Make sure that you have the prerequisites to enroll in the course.

Then, you can go ahead and make those changes! Be sure to review your fall schedule to ensure that the changes have been properly processed.
